"Hope: Jesus Changes Everything"

But God who is rich in mercy, out of the great love in which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses made us alive together with Christ. Ephesians 2:4-5

St. Paul describes our past lives before we knew Christ in very stark and discouraging terms. Without Christ we were dead through our trespasses, we lived in our passions of our flesh and followed the desires of body and mind. By nature, he says, we were children of wrath. But surprisingly, Paul replaces and overwhelms this bleak description in an astounding announcement: "But God, who is rich in mercy, out of his great love... has made us alive together with Christ... and raised us up with Him and made us sit with Him in the heavenly places."

No matter who we have been or what we have done, no matter how badly we may feel or others may feel about us, we have the assurance that "But God" has been written over our past lives. Have we wasted years of our lives with habits of which we are now ashamed? Are we guilty of having wronged people, even family and friends, in ways that we never thought we were capable of doing? Have we regrets or sorrows? There is an answer---BUT GOD...

If we continue to feel guilty we need to step back from our past, from our preoccupation with our wrongs and passions, until we can see them framed by God's amazing mercy; until our perspective again includes God's great promises of forgiveness and restoration; until once more we can see the cross of Christ "towering o'er the wrecks of time". Then we will be assured again that God's grace is greater than all our sin.

Any guilt or condemnation presently in our lives can be swallowed up once we are willing to let go of it, and throw ourselves upon the overcoming mercy of God. If we have confessed our sins and have received God's forgiveness, then "But God..." covers the past and paves the way for the future. How thankful we can be that we have a Savior who truly sets us free.

Oh God, whose glory it is to always have mercy, be gracious to all who have gone astray from your ways and bring them again with penitent hearts and steadfast faith to embrace and hold fast the unchangeable truth of Your Word. Amen

Lutheran Bible Translators (LBT) is a 50 year old organization that makes God's Word available to people in their mother tongue languages through Bible translation and Scripture engagement programs. The recognized service organization of the LCMS has produced forty New Testaments and four complete Bibles dedicated with an impact-audience of almost eight million people who would never have the chance to hear God's Word and come to faith in any other way.

The organization recently announced its relocation from Aurora, IL to the campus of St. Paul's Lutheran High School in Concordia, MO. LBT looks forward to the next fifty years of LBT missionaries and mission partners carrying the gospel to others in their own languages.
